We take bullying very seriously here at Ngongotaha School and will act swiftly and harshly on every incident we are aware of. The show also highlighted the issue around mobile phones, social media and how these things increase the problems. The internet is a wonderful thing but it really has changed the way our kids are growing up. Life is very difficult compared to when I was a 10 year old. According to the data presented on the show, 65% of New Zealand 11 year olds have a smartphone. Many of the issues we see with our senior school students early in the week are based around problems on social media that happened through the weekend. There is a reason why most social media sites have a minimum age of 14 years. Our primary school children's brains aren't developed enough to deal with the issues social media throws at them. I urge you, please restrict your child's use of social media while they are primary school aged and, if you do allow them to use it, check it regularly to see what they are doing. It is a very, very different world to be growing up in these days.

On a more positive note, we will be holding our first ever Matariki Breakfast on the morning of Wednesday 28th June. Our teachers and support staff will be cooking breaky for our school community from 8 till 8.45am. We are not asking for any donations of kai or for any money. 
