We have established procedures for teaching the expectations we have for students in all school settings. Just as we teach reading, writing, maths, art and physed we need to teach our students what behaviour is expected in the school setting.

These expectations are all linked to our school values for the various school settings and year levels of the students.

We have established a range of positive incentives for students to reinforce expected behaviours.

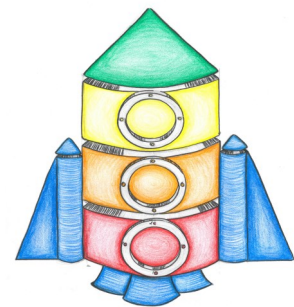
These include: **FISH Certificates** for class behaviour; **Values Vouchers** for the playground behaviour, **Brainy Awards** for academic progress and achievement, **Taonga Awards** for the rumaki setting, **Caught Being Great Awards** for class and playground behaviour. These are all

Each class has a behaviour rocket on display. The rocket has the names of the children on it and at the start of each day the children start in the green at the top of the rocket. If the child receives a warning from the teacher their name moves from green to yellow. If all goes well the name is moved back to green after the next break.

If there are further incidents the students name moves from yellow to orange and then red, this is an up to 10 minute time out and an up to 30 minute time out.

Any child who moves to red will be followed up by the team leader or the leadership team.
